Primary Purpose

Try Spotters are responsible for identifying who scores points during Rugby matches, recording the information and notifying Tournament scorers. There are 5 Try Spotters in the team with a roster rotation.

Key Tasks

- Watching Rugby matches and recording all tries scored during rostered shifts
- Notifying Tournament Scorers as to who the point scorers were on demand
- Be available for backup between shifts as and when required to cover each other within the team
- Ensuring you wear your uniform appropriately and be presentable at all times as you are seen on broadcast
